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As mandated by the American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS), the Board has developed a CC program that includes four components: Professionalism and Professional Standing (Part I) Lifelong Learning (CME), Self-Assessment (SA) and Patient Safety (Part II) Assessment of Knowledge, Judgment, and Skills (Part III) Improvement in Medical Practice (PIP) (Part IV)

Standing

II. Lifelong Learning, Self-Assessment, and Patient Safety Lifelong Learning (CME) Office achildres for each 3-year block CME can be ANY Category 1 credits relevant to one's field of practice. III. Assessment of Knowledge, Judgment, and Skills

- Available to all diplomates beginning with the 2022 ABPN assessments and exams

- Required to successfully complete a set of article exams for each of their certifications on an ongoing basis every 3-year block

IV. Improvement in Medical Practice

This quality improvement exercise is designed for **clinically active** physicians to identify and implement areas for improvement by choosing 1 of the following:

- <u>Clinical Module:</u> Review of one's own patient charts on a specific topic (diagnosis, types of treatment, etc.)
- Retable Module: Obtain personal feedback from either peers or patients regarding your own clinical performance using questionnairs or surveys.

Each Module consists of three steps to complete within a 24-month period:

- Step B: Identify and Implement Improvement


- · For the C-MOC program, one PIP activity is required every 3 years.
- ABPN does not collect patient or peer data. If audited, ABPN will require that diplomates explain how they carried out the Improvement in Medical Practice activity and submit information about their process and improvement plan.


Controversial PIP Act	ivities
Current requirements for CC activities for Board certified physicians within the CC process – in particular Part IV: Improvement in Medical Practice (PP) – have been the subject of increased discussion recently by physicians and medical societies.	Based on recent feedback from its professional society partners, the ABPN has respectfully asked the ABMS to consider modifying its 2015 MOC Standards so that Part IV is an optional component of MOC. Unless and until that happens, the ABPN will continue to follow the ABMS MOC Standards and require participating diplomates to complete all four Parts of MOC.






